Additionally, what role, if any, do pre-application meetings (or even earlier, meetings during the project planning stage) play in making multi-agency permitting portals work?

Does anyone use an "intake form" to gather project information that otherwise would be entered multiple times for each individual permit?

Re the cost question, Reporting piece is low cost - Took 1 FTE for 2 years after we standardized what was needed and definitions and ongoing we project .33FTE/year to support the improvements.
